Online Registration

Summer School

As noted in last week's newsletter, Brompton will be holding our first annual summer school program for Brompton students only. Parents were notified during conferences if their child qualifies for the program. Registration is under way in the school office between 7:00 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. Sessions will be held from June 25, 2018- July 26, 2018. We hope to see all of the students who are highly recommended in attendance.

Wisconsin Forward Exam

The Wisconsin Forward Exam is scheduled from March 19, 2018 to May 4, 2018. This is the state assessment that is given to all public school students. Results from this exam are used to determine our school report card. Information about student results is also used by our staff to determine areas where we are excelling and areas we need to improve upon in order to improve student achievement. We would appreciate it if doctor and dental appointments, as well as vacations, were not scheduled during this window of time. We appreciate your cooperation in making sure students arrive to school well fed, rested and ready for testing. Thank you for your teamwork.

MAP assessments

The MAP math and reading assessments will be administered from April 19, 2018 to May 18, 2018. This test will be administered to students once they finish the Wisconsin Forward exam. Information gathered from this assessment helps us plan instruction and interventions for students for summer school. These results are also used by teachers to plan the first quarter instruction of the new school year.
